Who Gets Your TV Dollars?



As more customers shift from traditional cable TV to streaming, one thing hasn't changed: big media companies are demanding higher fees from TV and streaming providers like Midstate. This raises the question: "Where is your money going?"

The image above breaks down your TV bill as if it were a hundred-dollar bill, showing how much each network receives. When media companies negotiate, they can demand higher rates or even pull their channels from your lineup if you don't agree with their rates, causing blackouts. These fees have skyrocketed—cable TV costs have increased by an average of 23.5% per year over the last 14 years. To put this into perspective, in 2010, a gallon of milk cost about \$3.25. If milk prices had increased at the same rate as programming costs, that same gallon would now cost a staggering \$62.00 in 2024.

Despite our efforts to keep costs low, we must pass along rate increases from programmers. Starting January 1, 2025, the new monthly rates will be:

Local Choice: \$67.05* Basic Choice: \$106.55* Digital Choice: \$114.55* Midstate X-Stream: \$109.55

All plans include a retransmission fee of \$38.10 for your local channels. (*Grandfathered plans are no longer available for new customers)
